Arts Place has been serving East Central Indiana and West Central Ohio for over 40 years. The Portland center was dedicated in 1983 and expanded in 2000. In 2005, Arts Place opened a second center in St. Marys, Ohio.

The mission of Arts Place is to nurture the creative spirit by making arts experiences, education, and services accessible to the region's residents, artists and cultural organizations.

Arts Place, Inc. provides a wide array of programming in both the visual and performing arts. Each year, Arts Place presents a series of performances featuring artists of national and international stature. Featured performers in recent years have included The Wailin' Jennys, Chris Brubeck's Triple Play, Michael Mauldin in *An Evening with Mark Twain*, The Chenille Sisters, and Rhythm in Shoes.

Arts Place also presents and curates exhibits throughout the year at both facilities. Exhibits typically feature the works of one or two living artists.

Providing instruction in the arts has been a central feature of our programming for over 30 years. Such programs as Arts in the Parks, Innovations, and MusicWorks provide unique educational opportunities for students of all ages.

In addition to direct programming, Arts Place provides a number of services to artists, cultural organizations, and the general public. As the Region Five Partner Organization for the Indiana Arts Commission, Arts Place provides grants, technical assistance, and information to

nurture and sustain the arts in East-Central Indiana. Most of these services are also provided, on a more limited basis, in West-Central Ohio.

Arts Place operates www.IndianaArts.org, a statewide arts database for artists and arts provider organizations across the state. A sister site for Ohio artists, www.OhioArts.org, was launched in 2007.

Financial Aid

Financial assistance is offered for both Innovations and MusicWorks instruction. A limited number of scholarships will be available to students who qualify. Scholarships are granted based on financial need and a serious commitment to study. Requests must be received by January 15, 2010 for priority consideration.

All applicants must fill out the scholarship application and submit a copy of the family's federal tax return for the 2008 year.

Through its facilities in Portland, Indiana and St. Marys, Ohio, Arts Place provides performing, visual, and educational arts programming. Arts Place proudly serves a 15-county region in East Central Indiana and West Central Ohio.

Frequently Asked Questions

- **Innovations and MusicWorks** classes are offered at Arts Place centers in Portland, Indiana and St. Marys, Ohio.
- **Registrations** will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis on receipt of registration form and payment. Registration will not be considered complete until the registration form is signed.
- All **Innovations classes** are 6 weeks in length. **Workshop** lengths vary, please see class description for details.
- **MusicWorks** private and group lessons last for 16 weeks, made up of one 16-week semester.
- **Visual arts classes and group music instruction** require a minimum of 6 students registered by the deadline *or that class will be cancelled.*
- **Private lessons** are available in painting, clay, dance and more. **Private parties and clubs** are welcome for tours, classes and/or demonstrations. Contact the Arts Place center nearest you for more information.
- **MusicWorks payments** are due monthly. At the time of registration \$10 per class is due. Contact Heidi Bouse, Director of Administration to set up payment schedules.
- All **MusicWorks lessons** will be scheduled at the time of registration on a first-come, first-served basis. Registrations will be accepted at any time. Register early for the best availability.
- The **registration fee** is non-refundable unless the class is cancelled by Arts Place.
- **Registration deadlines** for Innovations classes are January 15 and March 19. Priority enrollment date for MusicWorks classes is January 15, 2010.
- **Online registration** is available for MusicWorks group instruction and Innovations classes and workshops. Individual MusicWorks lessons are not available online due to their complexity.

MusicWorks Group Music Instruction at the Portland Center

Group instruction allows students to improve and sharpen their skills while adding to their general musical knowledge and enjoyment in an ensemble setting. Students sign up for 16 weeks (one 16-week semester) of group lessons unless otherwise noted.
